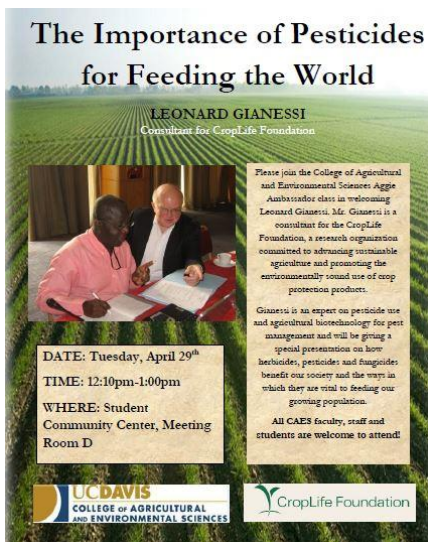


Foundation Makes Two Presentations at University of California Davis

On April 28, CropLife Foundation consultant Leonard Gianessi presented his talk on Herbicide Use Trends in California Crops at a Monday Weeders seminar at UC Davis in Davis, CA.
